YSOA Trainee Representative Report

From the Trainee's Desk

Hello everyone and Happy New Year!

I am here to share with you all the highlights of evening meeting which took place on 30th September at Hinsley Hall in Leeds. As always it was another enticing and inspiring meeting with interesting topics by excellent speakers. The theme of the evening meeting was dicing with death!

Dr Sarah Radbourne from Mid Yorkshire shared the learning experience from two tragic case studies. One was an undiagnosed peri-partum cardiomyopathy and another was an unanticipated placenta accreta who had a hyperkalaemia induced cardiac arrest. She emphasised in her talk that peripartum cardiomyopathy has a high fatality rate and should be thoroughly investigated in any pregnant patient. Whilst managing an unanticipated placenta accreta she suggested that an early decision for surgical treatment is essential to try to treat the torrential bleeding from a hypotonic uterus. She also warned the audience that hyperkalaemia associated with massive blood transfusion can be the cause of cardiac arrest and hence serum electrolytes should be measured regularly.

This was followed by another interesting discussion "A patient's story": Our patient with a coagulation disorder shared her experiences of how her treatment during pregnancy caused physical and emotional stress.

Dr Zahid Rafique, Consultant Anaesthetist from Hull shared his experience using social network to improve lives of many parturients in remote areas of Pakistan. What an inspiring talk it was!

Dr Sarah Price, Consultant Anaesthetist from Hull presented an interesting case of a patient who survived two separate episodes of cardiac arrest due to an atypical presentation of anaphylaxis.

The evening was concluded by Dr Emma Cottrell, CT2 Anaesthetic trainee who discussed a rare case of acute fatty liver. Another interesting case which any obstetric anaesthetist can come across in his or her career.

Thank you to all who attended and presented to make the Anniversary meeting as interesting and relaxed as usual!

YSoA History

Yorkshire Society of Obstetric Anaesthetists: The Journey So Far...



The Yorkshire Society of Obstetric Anaesthetists (YSoA) began life when a group of enthusiastic obstetric anaesthetists in Hull, East Yorkshire held the inaugural, enthusiastically attended, Hull Obstetric Anaesthesia Study day in 2008. The following year, York obstetric anaesthetists joined forces and together they ran the Hull York obstetric anaesthesia study day for the next few years attracting anaesthetists, midwives, operating department practitioners and obstetricians from East Yorkshire. Very soon, the meetings started attracting regular attendees from outside the region and assumed a broader Yorkshire picture. In October 2012 the Yorkshire Society of Obstetric Anaesthetists (YSoA) was formed and Dr Makani Purva, (Consultant Anaesthetist, Hull) and Sue Smith (Consultant Anaesthetist, York) were elected as President and Secretary. The membership of the society is free and open to all anaesthetists and healthcare professionals interested in obstetric anaesthesia.

Chloe Fairburn was the first elected trainee representative on the executive committee taking an active part in the society and helping launch it on social media, acquiring a twitter handle and introducing the more mature executive committee members to the world of tweeting!

Annual Scientific Meeting

The Annual Scientific Meeting (ASM) is rotated around East, South and West Yorkshire to allow all departments the privilege of hosting the event, often with a set theme. This promotes local participation, engagement and partnerships within the region's obstetric anaesthesia departments.

A key feature of the ASM and YSoA is the importance it places on trainees and providing opportunities for their development. The ASM offers opportunities for poster and oral presentations both with cash prizes!

For the first time in the last 4 years, YSoA ran the annual scientific meeting in collaboration with another professional group, the Hull Obstetrics and Gynaecology Medical Education group (HOGME). The meeting has grown from strength to strength with excellent feedback and loyal followers.

The evening meeting usually takes place on the last Friday of September to coincide with the anniversary of the Society's creation. This event is free and a more relaxed affair with a meal and guest speakers including a patient speaker to challenge and nourish the minds of the eager audience who attend these events.

Collaboration

YSoA has been active since its formation not only in the delivery of good quality meetings but also in acting as a platform for regional collaboration on matters of obstetric anaesthesia. Three noteworthy projects were completed through the good offices of the Society.

Basic obstetric anaesthesia simulation training course of Yorkshire (BOASTY)

A Yorkshire wide collaborative effort led to the launch of BOASTY to meet the needs of core anaesthetic trainees entering labour ward for the first time in 2011 and it has since been sustained through collaboration between YSOA members.

The Obstetric Anaesthesia Advanced Simulation Training course of Yorkshire (TOAASTY)

Following the success of the basic course, the advanced course was launched by obstetric anaesthetists from Hull, York, Leeds and Sheffield and is now run successfully twice a year for advanced obstetric anaesthetic trainees and consultants focussing not only on skills and knowledge but also on the leadership and human factor skills important on a busy labour ward.

Exchange programme for advanced obstetric anaesthetic trainees

A partnership programme has been created between YSOA members in Hull and Sheffield to provide trainees with an insight into the working of major obstetric units. This programme has allowed trainees to compare practices and reflect on the working of different units.

The Society has come a long way since its inception and has gone from strength to strength. The membership has continued to rise and the meetings are very well attended. The Society will continue to help obstetric anaesthetists prepare for the future to ensure that the care we provide our mothers is of the highest standard possible.
